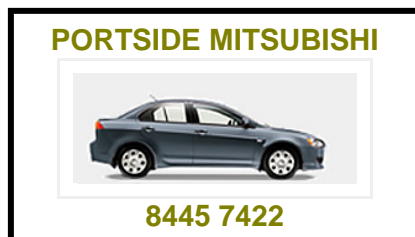
A GRADE MAKES 6 IN A ROW!
