A C Grade could be the link between our juniors and seniors, with a sprinkling of senior players available to assist juniors in their transition to senior ranks.

We are looking for players to register an interest in becoming part of the C Grade and help out in

- introducing juniors to seniors
- making the club a more competitive club by having a better, more depth, playing group.

#### Cricket in 2014 / 2015

Every year for the past few years the introduction of a cricket team playing out of our club, and under the banner of the Rosewater Football Club, has been canvassed. This year the oval is being used by several teams:

- Port Adelaide District Cricket Club male and female
- Port District Cricket Club
- A couple of specific clubs of players of sub-continent origin

To be part of the Adelaide Turf Cricket Association an application has to be made in April in the year preceding playing in the competition. We will make an application next April.

We would be looking to put in two grades – A and B grade in middle to lower, one day, limited over competition.

#### **Under 14 's Season Summary for Report**

Season 2014 was a long and very successful one for our Under 14's Team. But not quite the fairy tale ending we had hoped for.

With MWJFL introducing a White and Blue group for the 2013 season it allowed the smaller clubs to have a more even playing field. The coaching staff of Chris Cole and Rick Hillard planned that if we had a very fit side and started working with the squad early, we would have a better chance. With the assistance of Darren Stanton the squad stated training in October 2012 with 15 to 18 boys in the group.

Out first trial match was against Portland and showed that the fitness work had paid off. The squad had a few new members to the club who brought additional skills to the squad and we also have 3 new players who had never played club football. The nucleus of the team, 67% of the players, has been composed of Rosewater boys since Grasshoppers. We also had 2 of the Under 12's play 5 games to qualify them to Finals to cover any injury issue. These were Josh Morris and Anthony Giacobbe. We finished the year with a squad of 24.

The team went through the season undefeated, winning the Preliminary Final against Portland to win a place in Grand Final, the first time in almost 20 year for a Rosewater Junior team. However, playing Portland for the 5th time in a year proved to be our downfall with Portland taking out the Grand Final.

This was a win for MWJFL with the Portland boys all being new to Grand Final football also. So while disappointing for Rosewater, a great outcome for football in our area. The Under 14's had a number of players in representative Football in 2013 with Patrick Hillard and Cory Walker playing in the Port Adelaide development squad. Later in the year we also had Patrick Hillard, Nick Balchin and Josh Morris playing the Woodville West Torrens Schoolboy development squad.

Patrick Hillard finished the year in style taking out runner up in the MWJFL Best and Fairest and also the Club Best and Fairest vote. While MWJFL did not have a Team of the Year this year we did have 4 players in the top ten in their Medal Count. These were Patrick Hillard, Cory Walker, Edwin Milera and Izak Rankine.

2013 will hopefully prove to be a pivotal year for the Club.
