OLD DOGS DEMOLISH FAVOURED FAVORITE

Chris Cole was the story of the Old Dogs' triumphant return to Newcastle Street. Belying his 74 years, the dashing libero smashed all before him Sunday - mostly Rosewater bodies. Wearing the other side's guernsey turns Chris into a raging bull. It's partly the sense of freedom, but mostly it's the smell of freshly mown grass. The Dogs were relieved to get him back. In red, white and blue he played strictly according to Frank's instructions (no biting, etc), but still he dominated every contest, forced turnovers and delivered sweetly by hand and foot. All that said, it was hard to pick best players from a team that managed to be at times completely dominant against imposing odds. River Murray brought down a powerful side - albeit the bare 18. The presence of former Magpies skipper Corey Achee raised a few eyebrows on the Rosies side during the pre-game pleasantries. And he wasn't the only gun. Several caused real problems. Murray's movement up the ground and delivery to the forwards was, often, jaw-droppingly good. Still, the fact remains that keeping possession is a fail-safe way of dealing with such an opponent. Rosewater's vision and passing gave the false impression that everyone had been out to training. It helped that Chooker, Frank, Grant, Darius, Rash, Keith and Jockey repeatedly won clean ball from the centre bounces - from an opposition that was, itself, sure-handed and dangerous at the stoppages. Keith deserves special mention for the spearing penetration of his hand and foot passing, and the authority of his kicking for goal. Play of the day, though, was Chooker's. In a one-on-one, 50-50 contest with Achee our man commanded the space around the ball before snatching it up and weaving around and away from the desperately lunging ex-SANFL star. And he found the man in best position with the pass, of course. Best player - even better than Darius (electrifying), Chook ("how the #?!" did he do that"), Keith (magic) and Cole (terrifying) - was Michael Perks. Perks owned his back pocket, repeatedly out marking a skilful opponent in often unfavourable situations, winning the ball on the ground and hitting a teammate with the ball pretty much every time. He is now a complete player. Remarkable, this, as young Perks battled gamely through his first season without looking like a world-beater. His 100 percent commitment to the contest, and willingness to learn, have made the man into a monster. Special mention should also be made of Derek, who was slick in attack; Rash, who possibly picked up more kicks than anyone and wasted none of them; Mick, who had plenty of it; Brutus, who killed a lot of dangerous balls; and Beefer, who contested brilliantly up front and won the hard ball. Goal of the day was Mick's - not the prettiest, but savagely satisfying. Breaking clear of intense pressure to curl one in from good distance is about as good as it gets. Nice.
